

GENERAL COMMITMENT

I admit that I am a sinner, under the penalty and power of sin (1 Thessalonians 1:10; Romans 6:14) apart from the generosity of God and personal faith in Jesus Christ (Acts 4:12; Ephesians 2:8-9); Without God's grace in and through Jesus' perfect life, death, and resurrection, I would not have a saving relationship with God (2 Corinthians 5:18).

We will lead with gentleness and truth (1 Thessalonians 2:7; John 17:17).

We will reflect the humility consonant with the wonderful gospel of grace (Philippians 2:5-11; 1 Peter 5:3; 1 Timothy 3:6).

We will pray for you and the advance of God's glory regularly (Acts 6:4; 1 Timothy 2:1-3).

We will conduct ourselves with respect and love for everyone who is important to you, Christian or otherwise (Genesis 1:26; Colossians 4:5-6; 1 Timothy 3:2).

We will model faithfulness and live in a manner that displays God's love for his people by loving our wives (Ephesians 5:25; 1 Timothy 3:2).

By God's grace, we will preserve the faith once handed down (Jude 1:3) and teach not our own opinions, but the word of God (Titus 2:1).

We will encourage you to lead your families to the glory of God and we will model godliness for your children (Ephesians 6:4; Proverbs 31; 1 Timothy 4:8).
